



Environmental Policy Statement

Lee Warren Fabrication and Design Ltd seek to continually improve the environmental performance of our activities which are the design, manufacture, supply and install of structural steelwork (primary and secondary), basic metalwork, architectural metalwork. Design and install of architectural glass systems. We are committed to reducing the impacts to the environment from all areas of our operation through our ISO 14001:2015 compliant environmental management system.

Objectives will be agreed as a result of management review. This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure it is suitable for Lee Warren Fabrication and Design Ltd.'s continuing progress.

Aims

1. Ensure as a minimum standard, full compliance with relevant environmental legislation and other regulations applicable to Lee Warrens activities relating to sustainable use and protection of natural resources and the protection of the environment from the significant aspects of the work activities.
2. Raise staff awareness of and train employees on this Environmental Policy and environmental matters and legislation applying to the company's activities both at the factory and on site.
3. Monitor discharges and emissions to air, land and water to ensure they do not exceed limits, and implement appropriate action for the prevention of pollution.
4. Monitor carbon dioxide emissions and making improvements in energy efficiency.
5. Promote sustainable options for staff travel and reduce impacts from transport operations.
6. Monitor waste generation and recycling rates, promote waste minimisation and progressively improve levels of reuse and recycling in all operations including the lifecycle of plant and vehicles.
7. Where applicable, liaise closely with statutory and local authorities, clients, third party organisations and the general public.
8. Lee Warren Management Team will provide assistance to our Clients in developing a culture of sustainability during the design and construction phase of our operations.
9. Setting of appropriate targets (KPIs) which will demonstrate good practice in terms of sustainability.
10. Provision of presentation material on sustainable issues, including a presentation for the initial site induction and on-going tool-box talks;
11. Encourage suppliers and contractors, through appropriate specifications, to develop and supply environmentally preferable goods and services.
12. Carry out periodic reviews of the environmental performance and monitor progress against objectives and targets to ensure continual improvement.
